SHOW REPORT: The Baton Rouge show was April 1 through April 3. We would like to thank everyone that sent plants, brought plants helped with the exhibit or just came up and enjoyed the show. There were close to 30 exhibits and 10 vendors. Andra Mladinich and Becky Jolly-Wood did a 50 sq. ft. exhibit. The exhibit along with the plants did very well. Andra will give a full report at the meeting on the individual awards. The Exhibit itself won the AOS trophy with a score of 86 points. That qualified the exhibit for a Silver Certificate from the AOS. Terrebonne Orchid society and our Society both won Silver Certificates and we won the AOS award by one point, Terrebonne scored 85 points!

For those who don't understand about AOS trophies or Silver Certificates here's the definition of the AOS trophy straight from Baton Rouge's show schedule:

All certified AOS judges present, who are not involved in competition for the award, may vote by means of a secret, written ballot. To qualify for the trophy, two-thirds of the voting judges must vote in favor of some exhibit. If more than one third of the voting judges vote "No Award", the trophy shall not be awarded. The exhibit that receives the highest number of votes shall win the trophy. If a tie in votes exists between two or more exhibits, the exhibit with the highest score shall win. If a tie still exists, the chair of AOS judging, if eligible, shall cast the tie-breaking vote. If the chair is not eligible to vote, a designated reserve judge shall break the tie. Further information is contained in 6.3.2 of the *AOS Handbook on Judging and Exhibition*.

To be eligible to receive this award a total of 80 points must be received.

He says "A half-hour program in our usual slot just can't cover it all. Please bring a few plants, and whatever potting mix you may have, along with pots of different sizes, and utensils such as clippers, pot clips, stakes, wire ties, and anything else you feel you will need to pot your plants. CULTURE TIP: If you made it up to Baton Rouge you saw lots of Phalaenopsis orchids in bloom. This is their time to shine. Most of our members have at least one or two Phals. What if your plant's not blooming? What is wrong? If it's big enough to bloom and is growing well getting enough light and fertilizer, then there could be a couple possible reasons it's not blooming. The first is that it may be a Doritis or have Doritis in its parentage. Some Doritis like to bloom in the summer rather than the spring. Be patient, it may bloom yet. The other reason your Phal. may not be in bloom or bud is that they like a few cool (in the mid to high 60's) nights in the late fall.
