MOBILE SHOW: If our show isn't enough fun, the Mobile Area Orchid Society will have a show Feb 16-18, 2012. This will be the start of a long show season so keep 'em blooming!

HOW DO YOU KEEP 'EM BLOOMING? The best way is to give the plants the proper materials to grow and be healthy. If you have mature, blooming size Phalaenopsis that bloom in the spring, they should already be making spikes. If not, you may need to turn down the heat, let them feel a week of temps between 65 and 55 degrees and make sure they are getting enough light and fertilizer.

If you have Vandaceous plants give them fertilizer, bright light and a dose of Epsom salts. That's a tip we learned from Bob Fuchs when he visited with us a few months ago.

COELOGYNES: The photo to the left is *Coelogyne fimbriata*. It and the *Coelogyne rochussenii* on the front page (originally from Earl Young) are growing happily right here on the Gulf Coast. There were two *Coelogyne* species offered on our wholesale list. They weren't ordered. Could that be because our members simply aren't familiar with *Coelogyne*s? So here are the basics about *Coelogyne*s taken from personal experience with a little help from ***Home Orchid Growing by Rebecca T. Northen.***

The genus *Coelogyne* is native to North India and Ceylon. There are over one hundred species. Most like to be grown in baskets with a coconut fiber lining and a good bark charcoal perlite mix. They like lots of water in the growing season; dry them out a little in the winter. Since they have thin leaves try to keep water off the leaves in winter. During the summer they are happy under a shady tree or in a lath house **under** the Vandas. They prefer more shade than Vandas.
