Geri has been growing orchids for over thirty years and has been involved in the orchid business for over twenty five years. She liked Masdevallias and Miltoniopsis but hesitated to try them because of their reputation for being cool growers. When she and her partner opened a nursery in Brooksville, Florida, she set up a small greenhouse specifically for cool growers. Everyone thought she was nuts but the cooler growing plants grown in Brooksville started receiving AOS awards. Since she moved to Signal Mountain, Tennessee she developed the Cool Pots. They have allowed her to grow a much wider variety of cool growing plants. She began marketing the Cool Pots about three years ago. Last August, when Graham Wood from Lehua Orchids in Hawaii, spoke with us he recommended Geri and her cool pots very highly. More on Cool Pots later in this newsletter.

**COOL POTS:** (taken from the Orchid Gallery website)  
“These are clay pots designed and made by hand specifically to help you grow spectacular Masdevallias, Miltoniopsis and other orchids that like cool, damp conditions. They have a clay cone in the center and the drain holes are elevated slightly above the bottom of the pot, so the pot holds a small amount of water at the bottom after watering. They are fairly porous and absorb that water quickly. The water then evaporates from the outside of the pot and down through the center cone. This acts as an evaporative cooler and keeps the media around the roots 8 to 10 degrees cooler than it normal.”

“Since we started making and using these pots the difference in how well our mazzies and milts grow and bloom in them is amazing. They grow at least twice as fast as the plants in plastic pots on the bench right beside them. These pots are handmade from white clay and there are slight variations in size. They come in small, medium and large. These are perfect for Masdevallias, Miltoniopsis, Phragmipediums and any plants that like cool, wet conditions.
